

### Hyogo Prefecture: A Japan in Miniature

Located in the center of Japan, Hyogo Prefecture extends from the Sea of Japan in the north to the Seto Inland Sea and the Pacific Ocean in the south. It has a wide variety of communities ranging from large cities to rural villages to remote islands. It is known as a Japan in Miniature due to the diverse climates and cultural features.

In terms of industry, there are a number of key industries with world-class technologies and diverse local industries that boast the top market share in Japan. Development of innovative technologies is also underway, particularly in the fields of aerospace, robotics, health and medicine, and the environment and energy.

### • Kansai Region: Japan's Second-Largest Economic Zone

The Kansai region, centered around Kobe, Osaka, and Kyoto, is the country's second-largest economic zone and home to over 20 million people. Its economic scale is equivalent to that of an advanced nation, such as the Netherlands.


Kansai has prospered as the political and cultural center of Japan for a long time, and thus it has an abundance of shrines, temples, and historic sites, with about half of Japan's national treasures and important cultural properties located in this region. 


Hyogo, boasts a well-developed transportation infrastructure, including railways, highways, ports, and airports.

Convenient access by land, air, or sea will facilitate your business development.



### Speedy Access through Diverse **Land Transportation Networks**

Hyogo is a hub for land transportation. The Shinkansen connects Kobe to Tokyo in the east and Fukuoka in the west on the main transportation artery in Japan in less than three hours. The extensive highway network spans the entire prefectural area of approximately 8,400 km, allowing us to cater to diverse logistics requirements within the Kansai region and across the nation.



### International Trade Port Supporting Stable Transportation Services

The Port of Kobe connects to ports around the world through regular routes going to North America, Europe, Australia, and Asia. Domestically, it links to the ports in western Japan through an extensive coastal route network.

In the Harima coastal area centered around the Port of Himeji, where an international logistics terminal is being developed, plans are underway to create a carbon-neutral port to lead the efforts toward decarbonization.



### Connect to cities in Japan and the World

It takes about 65 minutes from Kobe to get to the Kansai International Airport (KIX), a gateway connecting Hyogo to 18 countries/regions and 45 cities around the globe. In addition to KIX, the three airports in Hyogo (Kobe Airport, Osaka International Airport, and Tajima Airport) that offer domestic services, adding to the convenience

In addition, Kobe Airport is scheduled to introduce international services around 2030, making it even more convenient.






